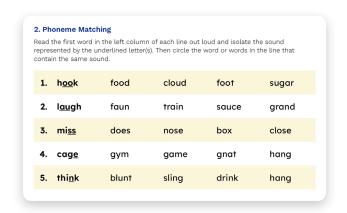


Phoneme Practice Activities for Para-Educators

Looking for more practice with phonemes? This practice packet includes six activities to exercise your knowledge:

- 1. Phoneme Awareness Warm Up
- 2. Phoneme Matching
- 3. Count the Phonemes
- 4. Identify the Phonemes
- 5. Isolate the Phonemes
- **6.** Segment the Phonemes



As you practice, say the sounds out loud and use strategies like finger tapping to count and recognize the phonemes. If possible, work with a partner so you can help each other!

Terms to Know:

- **Phonemes** are the individual sounds that we can blend together to make words. When we write phonemes, we write the letter used to represent the sound with slash marks on either side. For example, /s/ is the first sound in the word sat.
- **Phoneme awareness** is the knowledge of sounds and the ways we can manipulate them to make words like segmenting a whole word into its individual phonemes. For example, the word top can be segmented into three phonemes, /t/, /o/, and /p/.

- **5. Isolate the Phonemes:** examples may include 1. big, image, mitt; 2. mop, otter, cough; 3. eat, receive, beet; 4. oil, toy, coin; 5. fur, under, dirt

Segment the Phonemes:** 1. growth 4 phonemes /g/, /r/, /oe/, /th/; 2. axe 3 phonemes /a/, /k/, /s/; 3. pitch 3 phonemes /p/, /i/, /ch/; 4. brook 4 phonemes /b/, /r/, /oo/, /k/; 5. swish 4 phonemes /s/, /w/, /i/, /sh/; 6. touch 3 phonemes /t/, /u/, /ch/; 7. drum 4 phonemes /d/, /r/, /u/, /m/; 8. chalk 3 phonemes /ch/, /o/, /k
