Purpose: strengthen word-reading fluency

READING WORDS


In this activity, teachers will turn short words into new words by changing a single letter or sound, and students will read the words.


Materials:


• set of lowercase letter cards: set of lowercase letter cards: a, b, d, e, f, g, h, i, l, m, n, o, p, r, s, t, u, w

Directions:


- Select the letter cards needed to build all the words in the lesson. (If students need to review the letter sounds prior to reading words, do a quick warm-up with the cards.)
- Build a word with the letter cards (for example, *rat*) and make sure all students can see the word. You can do this with a pocket chart, document camera, whiteboard, etc.

VOCABULARY NOTE:

rat: A *rat* is a small animal like a mouse. However, it is bigger than a mouse.

map: A *map* is a representation of a place or area. I use a *map* on my phone to drive to my grandma's house. The globe is a *map* of the world.

tag: A *tag* is something in your clothing that tells you the size and type of fabric. *Tag* is also a game we can play at recess.

VOCABULARY NOTE:

rot: I left the banana out on the counter too long and it began to *rot*. It became all black and a little moldy. When trees fall down, they begin to *rot*.

rag: A *rag* is a torn piece of cloth. I used a wet *rag* to clean the counter.

wag: Wag is to move back and forth. When the dog's tail is wagging, he is happy. Look at the dog wag his tail!

VOCABULARY NOTE:

nut: A *nut* is a seed. For example, peanuts are *nuts*. So are almonds and walnuts.

hut: A *hut* is a small home, usually made of one room. An igloo is an example of a *hut*.

mug: A *mug* is a cup with a handle. I drink coffee from a *mug*.

VOCABULARY NOTE:

lag: When you are far behind the group, you *lag* behind. Don't *lag* behind our line as we walk to recess.

fog: Fog is like a low-hanging cloud that makes the air look hazy. You cannot see far away when there is fog.

lad: A *lad* is another word for a boy. We don't hear that word often in this country. But you can call a boy a *lad*. The three *lads* played ball together.



















